

Summer Sport is alive and well



A lot of the traditional stuff is missing and I feel badly about that, and on the other hand I have seen the return of fast pitch softball to Minto, joining the 6 team Fredericton District league. I see Dozens of Children playing Soccer at the lake under the guidance of the Glenn Family. I see a minor ball program being run at the same field with people like Bob Deap giving their time to run it. Mountain biking has become a major Activity over some of the most challenging trails in the Maritimes that is drawing people from all over Canada. A Lake fishing derby that is now drawing hundreds of participant from far and wide and has shown 300 % increase in registration in two years. The Grand Lake ATV club has begun expanding trails to connect with the Provincial trail system and every other backyard has a swimming pool while Washer toss has replaced horseshoes. And, although the Ridgeview Greens course is no longer in use Golfers abound with some having joined Old Mill Pond and Kingswood and many others utilize the beautiful Pines course at Grand Lake. I even had an opportunity to speak with George Gillett, which many of you know as the long time operator of Hoyt softball, and he tells me that at 83 years old he is still running a summer softball program with over 100 kids participating in his community, So, although sport and recreation is not what it was when we were kids I believe the sporting spirit in small communities may be as strong as we remember, just different.
